THE LEGISLATIVE BUZZ

I am pleased to report that the Annual VCOC Day at the General Assembly, held on Monday, January 25th, was a huge success. It was the largest number, nearly 70, of MOAA "stormers," in the 13 years that the VCOC has been gathering for this event and the largest number, over 70, of co-patrons signed up to support the JLC 2010 Legislative Objectives. VIPMOAA joined the other 17 Virginia MOAA Chapters and accounted for eight of the participants. Those from VIPMOAA who made the trip were President and First Lady Jim and Marvella Pauls; Immediate Past President Ernie Hinojosa; Past President, VCOC 2nd Vice President and VCOC and VIPMOAA Public Affairs Officer Melva Mallison; and Legislative Committee Members Charley Burch, Don Klovsstad, Stan Gorrell and myself. During the day, we met with seven General Assembly members, all but one of our senators and one of our delegates, both of whom were unavailable. All that we met with were complimentary of our organization and supportive of our objectives. They pledged support of the JLC Legislative Objectives to the extent permitted by severe budget constraints.


We were also fortunate to have several General Assembly members visit and address our assembled group, including the Speaker of the House and other key senators and delegates. In addition, the Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General and a cabinet member spoke to us. And for the first time in history, the Governor came to visit us in the General Assembly Building rather than have us traipse down the hill to the Capitol Building for his address. The Governor, a Richmond Area Chapter (RACMOAA) member, is most supportive of our legislative efforts but cautioned that, in these times of austere budgets, we should not expect to get all that we ask for, but he encouraged us to "be patient."

The next major legislative outing will be a visit to Washington, DC on Tuesday, April 27th when we attend the 25th annual VCOC-MOAA Virginia Congressional Delegation Appreciation Luncheon. The event will be hosted this year by Senator Jim Webb and will be held in the Russell Caucus Room on Capitol Hill. This annual event follows the storming of Capitol Hill by MOAA and Council Presidents and focuses on Virginia US Senators and Representatives and the top VCOC legislative priorities. More details will become available later as arrangements are finalized, but for those who may be interested in going, this is a great opportunity to have lunch and/or visit with your national representative. So, keep the date open and let a VIPMOAA officer or legislative committee member know of your interest in attending this year. (see related photos on pg 6)

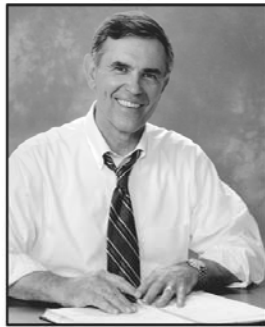

HONOR FLIGHT INVITES WWII VETERANS ON A TRIP TO DC MEMORIALS IN APRIL

The Honor Flight Historic Triangle Virginia (HFHTVA) is inviting WWII veterans to participate in the next Honor Flight trip scheduled for Saturday, April 17, 2010. MOAA Chapter members are encouraged to come out at 7:00 AM for the send off ceremony at the Colonial Heritage Club House across from the Pottery in Lightfoot.

The local Honor Flight Chapter will be making its third trip for veterans to visit the National World War II Memorial built in their honor. The goal of the Chapter is to assure every World War II veteran from the Hampton Roads, Richmond or northeastern North Carolina area that is able and that has not visited the World War II Memorial gets the opportunity to see it in person. Additionally, veterans visit the Arlington National Cemetery, other military monuments as time permits and the National Museum of the Marine Corps. There is no charge for the veterans. All veterans on the trip are accompanied by a trained volunteer guardian, who will assist the veteran for the entire day, and a staff of paramedics.

Veterans interested in participating in the all expenses paid trip must submit an application prior to March 24. Veterans or guardians can access the application at www.honorflightHTVA.org or by calling toll-free at 1-877-424-VETS.

Residents from our area that have a relative that is a WWII veteran that has not seen the WWII Memorial and does not live in the Washington, D.C. or surrounding area can consider inviting them to come here for a visit and to participate in our trip.

HFHTVA is part of the national Honor Flight Network. By the end of 2009, Honor Flight has taken 45,000 veterans to their memorial. There are over 70 chapters of Honor Flight in almost all 50 states.

Tax deductible donations to support this local program are needed, which can be done at our website, www.honorflightHTVA.org. There is a great sense of urgency in pursuing this program because we are losing our WWII veterans at the rate of 1200 a day.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL


